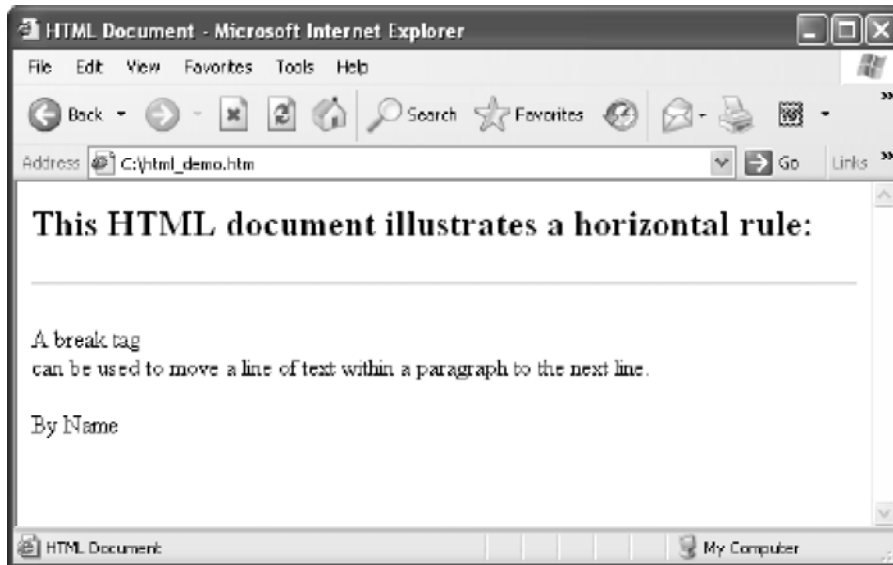


## Chapter 2 Case

### Case

1. Use Notepad to complete the following steps:
  - a) Create an HTML document that when viewed in a browser appears similar to:



The HTML document includes:

- The title HTML Document
  - The text This HTML document illustrates a horizontal rule: in Heading 2 format.
  - A horizontal rule across the width of the browser window.
  - All appropriate text enclosed in paragraph tags.
  - A line break after the text: A break tag
  - A script that displays HTML Document in the status bar of the browser window.
  - Replace Name with your name.
- b) Save the HTML document naming it html\_demo.htm.
  - c) Test the HTML document by viewing it in a web browser.
  - d) Print a copy of the html\_demo.htm HTML document from the browser.

2. Use Notepad to complete the following steps:

a) Create an HTML document that includes:

- A comment with today's date
- The title `Websites`
- The following text in Heading 1 format, replacing `Name` with your name:

`Websites by Name`

- A horizontal rule below the heading text across 50% of the page, center aligned
- The following text in a paragraph below the horizontal rule:

`The Web offers access to a multitude of information. One website category is portal.`

b) Modify the paragraph above so that `portal` is a link to a document named `portal.htm`.

c) Include an embedded style sheet with rules to format Heading 1 style in a blue color, center aligned. Also include a rule to format paragraphs in Georgia, Times New Roman, Times, serif font-family in a font size of 14 pixels and a line height of 16 pixels.

d) Save the HTML document naming it: `websites.htm`

e) Create another HTML document that includes:

- The title `Portal Websites`
- The following text in Heading 1 format, replacing `Name` with your name:

`Portal Websites by Name`

- The following text in a paragraph:

`Portal websites are created by businesses for the purpose of creating a starting point for people to enter the Web.`

f) Save the HTML document naming it: `portal.htm`

g) Print a copy of the `websites.htm` and `portal.htm` HTML documents from the browser.
